and the role of the State Disaster Plan is thus achieved, an amendment to current legislation would be necessary.

Recommendation: The provisions of the State Disasters
Act, 1983, be extended to cover the proposed policy
and organisational amendments.

## SECTION 3 - MITIGATION AND PREPAREDNESS

- 300. Mitigation and preparedness must always be regarded as a major bushfire counter-measure. Many discrete aspects influence its effectiveness. They include:
  - . General apathy within the community
  - . The policies and attitudes of governments
  - . Use of legislation and regulation
  - . Fuel reduction policies
  - The roles, responsibilities and powers of involved organisations, including local government
    - . Individual responsibility
    - . Special policies and measures in fire-prone areas
    - Emergency training, public awareness and education
    - . Preservation of the environment
    - . Insurance aspects.
- 301. Current standards of mitigation and preparedness in Victoria are too low, thus reducing counter-disaster effectiveness.

Recommendation: <u>Mitigation and preparedness be</u>
enhanced and maintained for the future. Some coordinating mechanism or system be introduced at
State Government level for this purpose.
